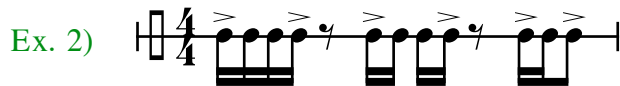
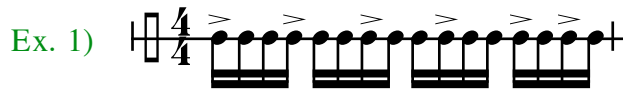
shaker, African shakeré(s), cowbell, woodblock, suspended cymbal, toms, deep djembé (bass note tuned to D)

Perc. 1:	shaker, shakeré.
Perc. 2:	cowbell, woodblock, suspended cymbal
Perc. 3:	toms (4, 1 low tom minimum)
Perc. 4:	hand clap(s)
Perc. 5:	low djembé (tuned to D if possible)

Performance Notes: Percussion Ensemble

- 1) Perc.1 is ideally for 2 players, one on shaker (16th notes) and one on shakeré (quarter notes). If only one player is available, then the shakeré part is preferred.

- 2) The hand clap part, Perc. 4, should ideally be at least doubled for a *chorus* effect (not *exactly* together)
- 3) The djembé part may also be doubled (perc. 5)
- 4) A talented djembé player (Perc. 5) may improvise within the basic 16th note pattern of 3+3+3+3+2+2 starting at bar 13. Improvised patterns might include:



All measures not based upon the above pattern (3/4 bars, empty bars, etc.) should be played as written.
